

## FAQs

- Do I have to be admitted into the MSU before applying to the nursing program?

All students must be admitted into the university before applying to the nursing program. Meet with the Office of Admissions to ensure you are admitted to the university and provide a student ID #. <https://www.morgan.edu/>

- Can we still apply for admissions if we are enrolled in spring classes?

Applicants are required to complete their spring courses with a passing grade of C or higher, in addition, applicants can also enroll in the Summer Session (I) with a limit of two courses needed to fulfill the admissions requirement.

- Are there any specific GPA requirements for acceptance into the nursing program?

Applicants are required to have a minimum GPA of 3.0 and higher. The department will consider a 2.8 GPA for admissions based on other application criteria and the admissions committee review.

- Can I apply for MSU Department of Nursing if I were admitted into another nursing program?

Typically, applicants are first-time nursing students. Prior admission to another nursing program will not disqualify admittance however, MSU nursing does not accept any transfer nursing courses.

- What standardized tests are required for admissions, and what are the minimum score requirements?

The ATI TEAS is the required assessment for admissions. The minimum score will be Proficient in all areas with additional scoring based on performance in each area. Those students who fall below proficient may still be given special considerations based on other application criteria and the admission committee review.

- Do we have to take the assessment on campus or at a PSI location?

The Department of Nursing will be administering the assessment on campus at the Earl Richardson Library on the selected dates provided.

- If I have taken the TEAS already, do I have to take the TEAS again?

The admissions requirement is for students to test with the department.
