

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the time commitment for this Fellowship?

The Fellowship program is considered a full-time position. General fellow hours range from 8:30am - 4:30pm M-TH with allocation as follows:

Semester 1: Four days per week online/on-site

Semester 2: Three days per week online/on-site AND one day for certification activities

Semester 3: Three days per week online/on-site AND one day for certification activities

Semester 4: Four days per week online/on-site

What is the start date for the Fellowship?

The Fellowship is slated to start August 22, 2022

What is the duration of the Fellowship?

The Fellowship is a two year commitment (24 months).

What if I graduate before the fellowship ends?

Fellows are expected to complete the commitment even if graduation occurs prior to fellowship completion.

Do I need a doctoral degree to apply?

No, the candidate must be an advanced student enrolled in the Morgan State University School of Community Health and Policy DrPH program at the start of the Fellowship.

Where is the position located?

The Fellowship is sponsored by Pfizer, Inc. and is primarily remote

Will this position require travel?

Yes, the position may require occasional travel to a Pfizer campus locations, and/or appropriate congresses and business meetings.

Do you sponsor work visas?

The position does not sponsor work visas.

Is this a paid opportunity?

Yes, the Fellowship position is a paid opportunity. The stipend is \$50K annually paid on a monthly basis.





Frequently Asked Questions

Will this accepting this Fellowship affect other funding I may have already received, or may receive in the future?

Fellows may secure other funding opportunities during the Fellowship experience unless it is in any way prohibitive of fulfilling the work commitment.

What does the Certification in Medicines Development entail?

The Certification in Medicines Development includes Online lectures, Webinar / Tutorials with Live Participation, Weekly Assignments and Assessments that culminate in certification from: IFAPP Academy in partnership In Partnership with King's College London.

The expected time commitment is approximately 8 hours per week.

The duration is 10 months, beginning in January 2023

This certification is included as a part of the fellowship curriculum and is covered by the Pfizer, Inc. Vaccines Medical Development, Scientific, and Clinical Affairs group
