Morgan State University-Behavioral Health Integration in Pediatric Primary Care

Position Overview:

The Morgan State University School of Social Work B-HIPP MSW intern will be co-located in a pediatric primary care office 3 days per week, or 2 days extended placement, for their Concentration year of the MSW educational program. Potential placement locations include Mercy Hospital, Johns Hopkins University, and others. The field supervisor will be designated by the B-HIPP Morgan State University School of Social Work program. Intern

Principal Duties and Responsibilities:

1. Provide screenings and assessments for pediatric primary care patients as requested by primary care providers.

2. Provide bridging counseling and brief interventions as requested by primary care providers and indicated through screening and assessment.

3. Coordinate community referrals and linkages for pediatric primary care patients as requested by primary care providers and indicated through screening and assessment.

4. Provide skills training (e.g. behavior management, stress reduction, limit setting, assertiveness, and parenting) as requested by the primary care provider and indicated through screening and assessment to the patients and their families.

5. Provide crisis intervention services within the primary care office as requested by the primary care provider.

6. Assist primary care providers as requested with the utilization of telephonic consultation support through the B-HIPP Maryland phone line.

7. Maintain clinically appropriate documentation of all client contacts to be reviewed by the primary care provider and included in the patient's primary care record in accordance with the pediatric primary care office's policies and procedures.

8. Participate in weekly on-site clinical supervision with the B-HIPP Morgan field supervisor, group supervision as scheduled by B-HIPP Intern Supervisor, and periodic training as scheduled.

9. Participate in staff meetings, consultations, and inter-disciplinary case conferences as requested by the primary care providers.

10. Maintain the highest level of patient confidentiality in all situations.

11. Maintain the level of professionalism expected from a clinician practicing at a co-located agency
