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SECOND-YEAR EXPERIENCE (SYE) PROGRAM

Coordinated by the Center for Academic Success and Achievement (CASA), the Second Year Experience (SYE) program is designed to engage all students returning to Morgan State University for the second year in out-of-classroom (experiential) learning opportunities. Through these opportunities students can enhance their career readiness skills and acquire the soft skills that employers desire.

SYE RECEIVES \$1M GRANT FROM JPMORGAN

In 2021, JPMorgan Chase awarded the Center for Academic Success and Achievement a \$1 million grant to enhance and incentivize our Second Year Experience (SYE) Program.

Second-year students who participate in an experiential learning opportunity and meet the requirements become eligible to receive the following incentives:

Student Incentives Scholarships (\$2,500)

Tablets Book Awards (\$500)

In addition, faculty who incorporate experiential learning activities for second-year students in their courses can apply for \$5,000 mini-grants.

FACULTY MINI-GRANT RECIPIENTS

Five (5) faculty from across academic disciplines were awarded \$5,000 JPMorgan Chase Second Year Experience mini-grants to incorporate experiential learning activities for second-year students into their courses. Below lists the spring 2022 awardees and their projects that were implemented for the fall 2022 semester.

Gabriel Kroiz School of Architecture and Planning

The project enhances the curricular experience for second-year students in ARCH 201 and ARCH 205 by offering two campus to career field trips to the Monuments on the DC Mall, the Glenstone Museum and the Academic Village designed by Thomas Jefferson. These field trips provided students with a firsthand experience of design projects and precedents that are currently introduced through textbooks.

Julaine Rigg School of Business

The experiential learning activity was integrated into the BUAD 202-Business Professional Development course which focuses on development and strengthening of second-year students business protocol and etiquette skills. Students engaged in a four-course meal dining experience where they practiced hands-on activities and expectations required for a formal dining job interview.

Kimberly Warren College of Liberal Arts (Psychology)

Students in PSYC 310 Health Psychology and GENL 396 Serve to Learn/Learn to Serve will learn about global health, serve a community in Guatemala by promoting health and are immersed in the culture. Participants not going to Guatemala will serve a community in Baltimore. Experiences are compared/contrasted upon return to the classroom.

Dawn Thurman & Sharon Javier School of Social Work

This activity integrated a campus to career field trip to the African American Museum of Art and a panel discussion/job shadowing experience to learn about contemporary African American pioneers who are fighting for social justice, equity, and inclusion. The experiential learning activity is associated with SOWK 200 (Introduction to Social Work) and SOWK 209 (Black Families).

Glenda Lindsey & Juanita Gilliam College of Liberal Arts (Family and Consumer Sciences and English)

Students engaged in this project were instructed how to interpret, examine, critically discuss and reflect on how Toni Morrison's Beloved informs Family and Consumer Sciences. Students will understand how the literary production dictates how the institution of slavery defines and constructs the modern-day family structure, dynamics, and interactions.

Second-year students visited the Patuxent Environmental Aquatic Research Labatory (PEARL) in Saint Lenoard, Maryland. Students explored the facility, learned about the research being conducted, engaged in seining on the beach, and examined oysters tonged from the Chesapeake Bay.

EXPLORE - ENGAGE - REFLECT

Students who have engaged in experiential learning opportunities such as internships, volunteering, research, job shadowing, campus-to-career field trips, career readiness workshops, part-time jobs are required to complete an Experiential Learning Plan (ELP). As part of the ELP, students are asked to reflect on their experience and share how their participation in an experiential learning opportunity enhanced their academic, educational, social and career readiness experience.

Below are a few of those reflections from the past year.

My experiential learning opportunity has enhanced my second year by allowing me to step out of my comfort zone. I was challenged to become more extroverted by collaborating with other interns, forensic interviewers, and family advocates. . . . I used my talents to engage in conversations with the team at Center for Hope, providing feedback and gathering data that resulted in advancements of current studies involving tele-forensic interviewing. I was also able to demonstrate communication skills to effectively contribute to team discussions.
