Greetings! Once again, our scholars have successfully completed another academic year and concluded the 8th year of the ASCEND Scholars program. To date, we have worked with 125 scholars. 109 of these students have graduated from Morgan State University, 26 have received a master's degree, and 2 have received a doctorate degree.

In May 2023, Cohort 7 scholars completed their tenure in the program by showcasing their entrepreneurial research. Their research ranged from examining the role of reactive oxygen species and macrophages in prostate cancer to assessing the impact of COVID-19 on risky sexual behaviors.

For the past 2 years these scholars have taken courses, professional development participated in activities, completed an internship, presented at conferences, and worked with faculty and near peer mentors on their entrepreneurial research projects. In this edition of the ASCEND Scholars Newsletter, we showcase Cohort 7 and 8 scholars, ASCEND Scholar Alumni and Ambassadors, the ASCEND Student Research Center, as well as our phenomenal mentors. The ASCEND Scholars program recognizes the importance of providing the mentorship and guidance necessary to grow our students intellectually and psychologically. The ASCEND program has brought together an interdisciplinary team of some of the best of those individuals. It does indeed take a village to BUILD and support the development of scholars who will address key problems facing our communities. Next year marks the last year of funding through the National Institutes of Health. 

Deja Caton, a member of Cohort 5, is currently pursuing her Master's Degree of Nursing at Johns Hopkins University studying to become a Nurse Practitioner. She also currently assists ASCEND scholars with their research as a Near Peer Mentor. Read on to hear how ASCEND impacted her life.



Q: AS AN ASCEND SCHOLAR WHAT WAS YOUR MAJOR, COHORT/ GRADUATION YEAR, AND RESEARCH FOCUS?

 A: I WAS A BIOLOGY MAJOR AND CHEMISTRY MINOR GRADUATING IN 2021. MY RESEARCH FOCUSED ON VAPING SPECIFICALLY ANALYZING THE DETRIMENTAL EFFECTS OF VITAMIN E ACETATE, A
CHEMICAL OF CONCERN LINKED TO THE OUTBREAK OF E-CIGARETTE OR VAPING-ASSOCIATED LUNG
INJURIES, OR EVALI. MY PARTNER, CHRISTABELLE AGYAPONG, TOOK THE APPROACH TO CORRELATE THIS WITH COVID-19 AS WE WERE IN THE LATE STAGES OF THE PANDEMIC.

Q: DESCRIBE THE MOST VALUABLE EXPERIENCE YOU RECEIVED FROM THE PROGRAM? A: TRAVELING TO ANAHEIM, CALIFORNIA TO THE ANNUAL BIOMEDICAL RESEARCH CONFERENCE FOR MINORITIZED STUDENTS (ABRCMS) WAS THE MOST EYE-OPENING EXPERIENCE. IT ALLOWED ME TO LEARN FROM OTHER STUDENTS. ATTENDING THE VIRTUAL CONFERENCE, THE FOLLOWING YEAR, I WAS ABLE TO BROADCAST MY RESEARCH AND TEACH OTHERS ABOUT WHAT I CONTRIBUTED TO THE SCARCE FIELD OF INFORMATION ON VAPING AND COVID-19. ADDITIONALLY, GAINING FEEDBACK FROM MY PEERS IN ADDITION TO JUDGES ALLOWED ME TO UTILIZE THEIR CONSTRUCTIVE CRITICS & BETTER MYSELF MOVING FORWARD.

Q: HOW HAS THE ASCEND SCHOLARS PROGRAM SET YOU UP FOR LIFE POST-GRAD? A: YOU TRULY WILL NOT UNDERSTAND THE EXTENSIVE GROWTH IN YOURSELF UNTIL YOU HAVE GRADUATED FROM THE PROGRAM. THE ASCEND SCHOLARS' PROGRAM HAS PROVIDED ME WITH BIOMEDICAL RESEARCH EXPERIENCE AND KNOWLEDGE THAT MANY OF MY PEERS IN GRADUATE SCHOOL HAVE NEVER OBTAINED PRIOR GIVING ME THE ADVANTAGE. I AM ABLE TO EFFECTIVELY CONDUCT RESEARCH AND CRITICALLY THINK WHEN ADDRESSING HEALTH DISPARITY PROBLEMS.

Q: ANY ADVICE FOR CURRENT ASCEND SCHOLARS ON GETTING THE MOST OUT OF THE PROGRAM? A: TAKE ADVANTAGE OF EVERY OPPORTUNITY ASCEND HAS TO OFFER AS IT WILL GET YOU INTO MANY DOORS. AS IT IS SUPPORTED BY THE NIH, THE ASCEND PROGRAM HOLDS WEIGHT IN TERMS OF APPLYING FOR INTERNSHIPS, FELLOWSHIPS, JOBS & GRADUATE SCHOOLS. WITH THAT BEING SAID, NETWORK AS MUCH AS YOU CAN! ACCEPT AS MANY OPPORTUNITIES AS POSSIBLE TO PRESENT AT CONFERENCES. PUSH YOURSELF OUTSIDE OF YOUR COMFORT ZONE AS IT WILL MAKE YOU MORE SUCCESSFUL. ASCEND HAS PROVIDED YOU ALL THE KNOWLEDGE YOU NEED TO SUCCESSFULLY PRODUCE RESEARCH, SO DON'T HESITATE TO SHOW OFF YOUR HARD-WORK!



ADVICE FOR RECENT GRADUATES

- Research jobs and apprenticeship programs that align with your passion, education, and experience
- Check what certification/licensure is required for the positions you want
- Ask for recommendation letters early so your recommenders can just tweak it to each of your applications
- Stay in contact with hiring managers even if they don't have a position for you right away---something might come up in the future and you'll be the first person they contact before posting the job.

- Utilize social media, linked in, and email where it applies to stay in touch with people you met during your tenure at Morgan
- Find a hobby or interests and incorporate it in your weekly schedule
- Prioritize your principles and create a lifestyle that matches your beliefs
- Identify and amplify your marketable skills
- Apply to jobs early and constantly, you never know what you'll come across if you keep looking

Don't get too comfortable, stay goal oriented, and remember this is just the end of the beginning. Your next chapter holds so much more!
